

Bicton Park Botanical Gardens

Group visits

Bicton Park, set in the picturesque Otter Valley near the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site of East Devon, is one of Britain's most beautiful historic gardens. With a blend of 18th-century tranquillity and modern facilities, we offer enjoyment for people of all ages throughout the four seasons. We welcome group visits and can accommodate large numbers in un-crowded comfort in our 63 acres (25 hectares) of Grade 1 listed gardens and parkland.

OPEN ALL YEAR From 10am (closed Christmas Day and Boxing Day). The park is designed to provide all-year interest. We suggest you allow two and a half to four hours for a visit, although many visitors do stay longer.

OUTDOORS Bicton's centrepiece is the formal Italian Garden, with its fountains, lake, flowerbeds and ornamental trees. Some of the world's rarest conifers form a dramatic landscape in the Pinetum. Other special areas include the American Garden, Stream Garden, Mediterranean Garden and Rose Garden.

RAILWAY Taking a 25-minute trip on the Bicton Woodland Railway gives visitors an ideal way of viewing the parkland especially the less able; the train can also accommodate wheelchairs.

HISTORY The Italian Garden was laid out in c1735. Many features were added in the 19th century by Lord John and Lady Louisa Rolle. The gardens were opened to the public by Lord Clinton in 1963.

INDOORS Lunches, teas and light refreshments are served in our spacious Orangery Restaurant. The historic Palm House and other 19th-century glasshouses appeal to plant-lovers, while the Countryside Museum features traction engines among hundreds of other exhibits. The quaint Shell House contains an international collection of seashells. We have a well-stocked Gift Shop and Garden Centre.

CHILDREN Our indoor and outdoor play areas are superbly equipped for maximum fun. We now have an all-weather football pitch, tube slides, and much more. The fully heated Play Barn includes giant slides, foam brick building and a toddlers' area.

WHEELCHAIRS The park is wheelchair friendly, with smooth paths in the main garden areas and easy access to the train and toilets. Please be aware, however, that there are some steps and slopes.

GROUP PRICES (to be paid by driver or group leader in one)

Admission: Adults £5.95 or £7.45 with train ride; Children £4.95 or £6.45 with train ride. Group cream teas £4.95 (must be pre-booked).

DIRECTIONS Follow the brown 'Bicton Park' signs. We are 10 miles SE of Exeter (M5, junction 30), between Newton Poppleford and Budleigh Salterton on B3178.

PARKING There is ample free parking space for cars, mini buses & coaches.
